August Arch

The Augustus Arch was built for the emperor Augusto (by the Romans Senate) in 27 b.C. It is the oldest Roman arch left. Here, in the past, the famous Via Flaminia stopped.

Its style is sober but at the same time it is majestic.

It represents the main entrance to the city because it is the most important door with both decorative and functional characteristics.



TIBERIUS BRIDGE

This bridge was built in 14 a.D. but it was finished in 21 a.D. under Tiberius' power.

It was built with the same stone (Istria's stone) as the Augustus Arch (that we visited before).

It is composed of 5 arches with different size.

From this bridge started two important Romans streets, the Via Emilia Street and the Via Popilia.



Three Martyrs Square

The square is in the historic center. It was built in 268 b.C flowing into the cardo and the decumanus, the most famous roman streets.

In the past it was surrounded by statues and architectures. Nowadays it still has got a bronze statue that recalls the speech that Julius Caesar addressed to his troops, after passing the famous Rubicone River.



Cavour Square

Cavour Square is both the political and administrative centre. Since the Middle Ages It is the most important square because of the fountain, the town palaces, the cathedral and the castle.



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
